

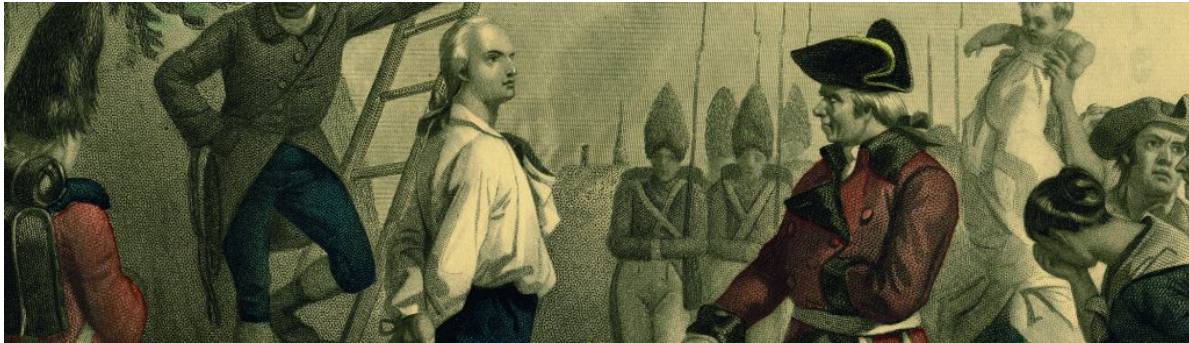
Tories, Spies, and Traitors: Divided Loyalty in Revolutionary Connecticut

Loyalty was not only a matter of words or opinion. For soldiers and civilians alike, loyalty could mean loss of fortune, friends, and even of life. This presentation reveals stories - some well-known, some obscure - of Nutmeggers, including one from Washington, CT, who risked and sacrificed to support their chosen side during this "tumultuous jarring time of civil war."
